Northeast Ohioans to kick off WELCOME campaign for Gay Games participants Rally planned for Friday at Tower City to sign WELCOME cards, autograph banners

Gay Games, LGBT Center and Plexus unite to host first-time event

CLEVELAND, Ohio – Northeast Ohioans are invited this Friday, Oct. 4, to start welcoming the thousands of participants planning to come next August for the 2014 Gay Games presented by the Cleveland Foundation.

With a brief program at 12:30 p.m. Friday at the Grand Staircase in Tower City, the WELCOME kickoff enables people to show their support by personally signing a WELCOME card that then will be sent to an individual participating in the Gay Games. More than 2,000 participants already have registered, with another 8,000 expected to do so before August.

The rally kicks off a 10-month WELCOME campaign organized by the Gay Games and its recently announced lead community partners, The LGBT Community Center of Greater Cleveland and Plexus Chamber of Commerce.

All three partners encourage organizations, businesses and individuals to help foster a welcoming atmosphere and get involved in the campaign. Those opportunities include: hosting a WELCOME card-signing party, acting as a drop-off site for WELCOME cards, posting a WELCOME poster or banner in the office, storefront, neighborhood, recording a brief WELCOME video or snap a WELCOME photo, etc.

The Gay Games is an international sporting and cultural event held every four years under the founding principles of Participation, Inclusion and Personal Best™. Launched in 1982, the Games invite participation from everybody, regardless of sexual orientation, race, gender, religion, nationality, ethnic origin, political beliefs, athletic or artistic ability, age, physical challenge or health status.

The Games are intended to bring a global community together in friendship, to experience participation, to elevate consciousness and self-esteem, and to achieve a form of cultural and intellectual synergy. The Gay Games is open to anyone 18 years or older. About 10 percent of participants are from outside the LGBT community.

The 2014 Gay Games presented by the Cleveland Foundation will be August 9-16, 2014, in venues around Cleveland and Akron, Ohio, in the United States. More than 35 sports and culture events will be held, with more than 11,000 people from more than 60 countries expected to participate.
